



Site Waste Management Plan

Site Waste Management Plans are a legal reporting, monitoring and training requirement for all construction and demolition projects in England.

A Site Waste Management Plan must be produced and available for inspection before construction begins and be available for inspection for 2 years after project completion.

There are 3 stages in producing a SWMP:

1. Before Construction Begins - certain project details must be provided together with an estimate of the site waste that will be produced and a plan for its management.

2. During Construction - the waste actually produced, together with certain details relating to its disposal and/or management must be recorded, and the plan updated and monitored regularly.

3. After Completion - depending on the type of SWMP there are further monitoring and reporting requirements.

There are 2 levels of Site Waste Management Plan required by the Regulations depending on the cost of a construction or demolition project:

Basic SWMP for projects above £300,000 and up to £500,000 in cost excluding VAT. Detailed SWMP for projects above £500,000 in cost excluding VAT.
